Features and Benefits

What is a Zimlet? A Zimlet is a small, self-contained application that can be added to extend Zimbra's functions. It can be used to add new features, change the look and feel of the user interface, or integrate with third-party applications.

Pro Mente Tirol also adapted Fail2Ban, a customized solution, to work with Zimbra to further enhance the security measures of its business.

The native usage of ActiveSync has been a huge advantage for the organization, enabling seamless mobile usage and further facilitating collaboration on the go.
